### March brings breezes .... and a new editor?

### WHERE IS THE IMPROVED RELIABILITY?

**Youtheastern's** new timetable was introduced in December without any consultation and despite strong opposition to it from Rail User Groups, local community groups, Greenwich Council and MPs from all parties. At the time of writing the timetable has been operating for eight weeks and the experience has not been the improved reliability that Southeastern had promised. Instead it has been a tale of delays and cancellations,

overcrowding and horrendous congestion at London Bridge which even made the national

A local resident who moved to the area last year has told us of their experience since the timetable changed. A "great commute" before December 2022 has turned into one where their morning train is never on time, is further delayed on the journey into London, and on which it is difficult to get a seat. In the

evening, they find the narrow platform at London Bridge overcrowded and dangerous. On the Greenwich line on time punctuality (i.e. trains arriving within 59 seconds of their scheduled time) in the first eight weeks of the timetable has fallen dramatically from the previous 71.3% to 61.8%. Cancellations rose initially from 2.2% to 6.8% although have now dropped back to 2.8%. To look in more detail at what was happening the


Greenwich Line Users Group monitored the service from 24th to 28th January, using data from Real Time Trains. This week was chosen because there was no bad weather and no strikes, so services should have been running smoothly. The reality was very different, particularly on the services into London. Most weekdays there are 45 Southeastern services from Westcombe Park and Maze Hill Continued on page 4

Telp shape neighbourhood **L**improvements in West and East Greenwich.

The West Greenwich Low Traffic Neighbourhood, trialled from August 2020 to December 2021, generated a balance of both positive and negative comments. Many of the critical opinions came from residents in East Greenwich and Westcombe Park who felt the impact of road closures. The LTN was not made permanent and the council agreed to consult on a future plan. This consultation has now begun and continues until March 24th in an attempt to find 'safe and attractive travel options for

everyone'. It is in line with the council's Borough-wide Transport Strategy and their commitment to achieve a carbon neutral borough

The on-line consultation includes an interactive map of the area which enables responses to be made in relation to specific places. So far as at 14.2.23 there have been nearly 500 comments. n 2023 Blackheath Prep on St. Germans Place in Blackheath, celebrates 200 years since its foundation in 1823 by the Reverend Greenlaw. The school was originally known as Christ's College, a boys boarding school, largely for the sons of servicemen and officials working overseas. In 1998 Christ's College closed its doors and the school became known as Blackheath Preparatory



School and Nursery. An exciting year-long programme of special events and collaborations will take place across this year to celebrate Blackheath Prep's bicentenary, including special learning projects, events, community engagement and fundraising for local charities including Age Exchange Blackheath, Creekside Discovery Centre, Greenwich and the 999 Club, Deptford. to Cannon Street. In that week on the "best" day, if that is the right word, only 16 services arrived on time. On the worst day, just 5 services arrived on time. That is a performance which is inexcusable, and as most of these trains are scheduled to run only seven minutes ahead of the following Thameslink service, they frequently delay Thameslink as well. The performance is summarised in the table. The basis of Southeastern's assertion that reliability would improve was that conflicting train

movements at Lewisham would be largely eliminated by diverting services. As a result Southeastern services through Greenwich now run via Bexleyheath instead of Sidcup but instead of improving reliability it has worsened considerably.

It is depressing that train services on the line have deteriorated from the December 2019 timetable, which had a reliable service at 10 minute intervals, to the present shambles. Blaming Covid and reduced passenger demand is not an excuse for poor performance. Southeastern have partly defended the changes by saying they will save the taxpayer £10m a year. but most passengers are taxpayers themselves and deserve a reliable service that takes them where they want to go. Worryingly, the company have also stated that any future increase in services will depend upon finance being available.

The Greenwich Line Users Group will continue to press for improvements in rail services and the return of the "turn up and go" metro service we enjoyed for many years.

#### Addendum:

The Blackheath Society arranged a survey of local residents, some of whom live in Westcombe Park and have used Blackheath for its direct service to Charing Cross.

The results show extreme dissatisfaction with the new timetable, in particular the lack of trains to Charing Cross, difficulties changing trains at London Bridge and Lewisham and severe overcrowding, not just at peak times but off-peak as well. What is shocking is just how long journey times have become and the convoluted variations of journeys that people are making as they struggle to get to their destination. For those with a disability, travelling with prams, children and luggage it's real struggle especially as lifts at Lewisham and lifts and escalators at London Bridge have frequently been out of order. The results of the survey show the need for a serious rethink to: bring back the Charing Cross trains; limit the need to change en route; ease overcrowding;

ease overcrowding; make it easier for passengers with disabilities or travelling with prams, children, luggage etc.; speed up the trains; provide more frequent, better spaced trains and a much better planned timetable;

listen to the passengers and meet their needs

So very similar concerns and wishes..

We are creating new public spaces, community facilities, and a haven for wildlife As part of Greenwich Park Revealed we are creating some exciting new community facilities in the 'Blackheath' South side of the park this year. These works are expected to be completed by December 2023.

Several closures will affect the Flower Garden between January and April, including Blackheath Gate, Bower Avenue Gate, and lake access, whilst these works are delivered. The Flower Garden gate from Bower Avenue will be closed for

This will be the fourth Marathon Helen's run for local sports inclusion charity South London Special League (SLSL).

Disabled people in the Royal



Borough of Greenwich are among some of the most deprived in London. These can be isolated lives, unable to connect with the local community or benefit from the physical and mental boost that comes from being involved with team sports.

"SLSL is a unique award-winning charity providing much-needed opportunities for young disabled people and adults to improve their lives through football and a variety of other sports including tennis, Boccia, New Age Curling and Seated Volleyball," says Steve Johnson, SLSL's Strategic Development Manager.

"By providing these activities, we're breaking down the social, economic, and environmental barriers to inclusion along with the inequalities disabled people confront when accessing sport and leisure activities," says Steve.

This year, the fundraising focus will be Greenwich Powerchair Football Club (GPFC). The Club is one of SLSL's flagship projects. Since its inception in 2007, it has seen some notable successes including a promotion into the top division and a player who will be part of the 2024 Paralympic Squad – Kyle Alexander. "I have Cerebral Palsy, it's a challenge but I enjoy a challenge," says Kyle.



# Will(ow) they or won't they survive

One view

Walking from Greenwich along the Thames path, and nearing Morden Wharf, one comes across some old apple trees on the riverbank. In a famous civil engineers of the day, Thomas Telford and John Rennie, were asked to come to Greenwich to deal with a threatened breach in the sea wall somewhere near today's Morden Wharf. Some 20



good summer they produce a bumper crop. Much prettier and more distinctive, however, are the row of 11 weeping willow trees that waft and grace the shoreline over a small golden beach. One comes across this delightful little beach suddenly, just as the path narrows and veers 90 degrees to the Wharf. Upsettingly, these much-loved willows, which have been a feature for more than 40 years, are due to be felled. The developer Landsec that recently bought Morden Wharf says the trees are damaging the retaining wall, and hindering plans to strengthen flood defences which the Environment Agency says must

Council Planning Officers recommended the plans be approved but, at the February planning board meeting, Councillors agreed a 2-month stay of execution for the trees to allow further consideration of how best to widen the Thames path by the Wharf and strengthen the riverbank.

### And ... another

Sentimentality about the willow trees should not override commonsense. This is not a 'riverbank' but a sophisticated, engineered sea wall with an illustrious history. It should not have big trees growing on it! Many years ago I found a packet of papers at the London Metropolitan archives which were about the Greenwich Peninsula in the 1820s. It told how the most


years earlier an obstruction in the river, the Blackwall Rock, had been removed and there were increased ship movements at the new West India Dock entrance opposite. Changes in currents were threatening a terrible disaster. Telford knew, as we ought to, that sea walls need constant and absolute attention. They are vast civil engineering structures built hundreds of years ago, and mostly we don't even notice them. We don't know how old the walls are which keep the Greenwich Peninsula safe. Some say they are Roman and a recent article about the area in the Bronze Age suggested that it was once a series of islands. Commissioners were appointed to oversee their safety in the Middle Ages and extensive remedial work was done under the Tudors. Looking after them properly is for the long term and needs care. Surely it is much greener to maintain assets inherited from before the over-use of carbon and not to neglect them for short term prettiness? Greenness ought to be about long term sustainable care. And wouldn't it be nice if we recognised that in the 1820s it was felt necessary to use the most important civil engineering talent in the country to sort out the flood defences of the Greenwich Peninsula. Perhaps a plaque to Thomas Telford?

# CHANGES TO BLACK BIN COLLECTIONS

From Monday 27 February, your general waste in your black top bin will be collected every two weeks. Your food and garden waste bin and recycling bin will still be collected every week.

If you live in a property that uses wheelie bins, your general waste will be collected every two weeks. You will not be affected if your property cannot have bins or if you live in a flat with communal bins. These changes are being made to move Towards Zero Waste, this is a vital step in action against the climate emergency. Fewer waste collections will save 60 tonnes of CO2 each year. By recycling more less waste will be incinerated which is kinder to the planet.

Watch the RBG video to find out how they are moving Towards Zero Waste or read the video transcript This change comes after a six week consultation in 2020 which confirmed that most residents understood the need for the changes proposed. Generating less general waste in the borough will also support the Mayor of London's Environment Strategy to reach a London-wide recycling rate of 50% by 2025. Many London boroughs who have switched to collecting general waste every other week have seen increased recycling rates. Read the Carbon Neutral Plan to see what else the council is doing to respond to the climate emergency.
